- Dredging Report – Wayne Woolwine said the attorneys and McLeskey are trying to agree on verbiage to deed the bottom of the canal. Once signed, the paperwork needs to be submitted to the city and Chesapeake Bay board. It will then take 4-6 months for approval. Spoils are to be trucked out. Some of the PVC pipes have broken and there was concern they pose a danger.
- Compliments were extended to the Garden Club who has spruced up the front entrance with new plantings. Concern was expressed about the timing of the sprinkling. Since it is fall, plantings do not need as much water. BJ will be asked to adjust the sprinkler system

The Board will look into changing the meeting time and place. People may be more willing to go to someone's home. Saturday morning availability at the church will also be explored.
