

## CHESOPEIAN COLONY CIVIC LEAGUE MEETING

June 22, 2010

President Todd Lovelace called the meeting to order at 7:31 p.m. There were 17 residents in attendance.

Secretary's report: A motion was passed to waive a public reading of the minutes since all in attendance received a copy. Minutes approved.

### Committee Reports:

- Security - Ron Hess noted the "E" is missing from the eastside wall. A replacement cost is estimated at \$75 - \$100. Ron periodically checks the sex offender registry and there are none living in the neighborhood at this time. He would like to thank the Block Captains for doing an outstanding job.
- Newsletter - Bill Thesier said he is trying to keep the newsletter to 8 pages. The earlier he gets the submitted articles, the easier it is to move things around to maintain the space. He would like to pick up some new advertisers to help offset the cost. He agreed to devise a written policy for advertising/costs to submit to the Board.
- July 4th Parade and Picnic - Janet Webster said all outside entities have been arranged. Volunteers are still being recruited. Ron has been authorized by the City to give street monitor classes and provide certification. Since July 4th is on Sunday, there was discussion about church goers leaving about the same time as the start of the parade. Changing the date to the 5th is not feasible because the permit has been issued for specific times and all vendors have been contracted. A flyer will be sent out reminding neighbors of the street closing and Susie will send out a reminder email just prior to the date.
- Website - John Davis has done a terrific job with the website. Minutes from the past year are posted. he would like prior year's minutes from Betty Kennedy to include as well as past newsletters. - Garden Club - Jennifer Coleman said the club had an "end of season" party hosted by Betty and Bill Kennedy. The club will resume their meetings in September.

- Welcome - Susie and Ron are going to discuss a way to coordinate new resident's welcome with the block captains and the welcoming committee.
- Beautification - No report.
- Clean the Bay Day - Tom McLaughlin said participants picked up 400 pounds of trash around the Colony waterways and the adjacent shopping center. Subway gave the participants sodas. According to Tom, overall the shoreline is spotless. Residents are doing a great job of taking care of their property. In the past, an average of 10-15 people participated and this year there were 34, including 9 cub scouts. BJ said he found an old crab pot covered in barnacles near marker 40 (Wolf's Neck Rd. area) but was unable to dislodge it. There is also a tree in the water.
- Scholarship - Jennifer reported that Matthew Wheeler, son of Mat and Linda Wheeler was awarded the scholarship. He will be attending the US Military Academy at West Point. Congratulations Matthew! Jennifer will do a write up and send it to Susie to email the residents.
