

Chesapeake Colony Civic League Meeting

June 12, 2012

Meeting called to order at 7:10 p.m. at the Foundry United Methodist Church. There were 8 residents in attendance.

Minutes from the April 19, 2012 meeting were approved as presented.

Treasurer's Report: As of 5/29/12, 159 residents have paid their dues. There was no formal Treasurer's report submitted.

Security: There have been no incident reports since the last civic league meeting.

Website: BJ is still working on collecting colony newsletters and adding them to the website. There is a facebook page for Chesapeake Colony residents.

Beautification: The new letter at the front entrance has been installed. There are several other letters that are damaged. They all need to be painted which will be a good fall project. The foreclosure on the Trail/Sandy Valley is now with a realtor. No other beautification measures are planned at this time.

Garden Club: The spring party will be June 23rd at 6:30. The group will reconvene in September. They have done a great job with the flower beds at the entrance.

Clean the Bay Day: The group of volunteers collected a large amount of trash. For those that have worked with the event over the years said the area is 75% cleaner than when we started. Our group connected with the Kings Grant volunteers for trash pickup on the west side.

Council of Civic Organizations: There is no representative from the Colony at this time. Janet welcomes anyone who would like to volunteer.

Welcome Committee: Betsy and Susan discussed developing a new plan by sectioning off the colony and have volunteers assigned to each one. We are not getting the new resident information from the block captains.

Scholarship: Matt Knight was awarded the 2012 scholarship. He is a graduate of Cox High School and will attend Va. Tech in the fall. The committee plans to put a scholarship donation jar on the registration table at the 4th of July event.

4th of July Party: The permit application has been submitted to the city. Ron is set with his street monitors and Kevin has the activities organized.

Dredging: All the information has been submitted to the city. Dave Hansen, Deputy City Manager, will notify Janet when the petitions are to be mailed. He was very complimentary to our neighborhood. Although he has received emails indicating concerns the dredging of the river was not in writing, he assured us

the city is committed to the redevelopment of the Lynnhaven area and it would be addressed.
